Home Repair Program

Habitat for Humanity of Bucks County partners with homeowners to make minor home repairs or modifications that preserve their home, make it safe and adapt it to be accessible for everyone.

Typical Repairs

EXTERIOR

- Ramps, railings, and other accessibility modifications
- · Repairs of doors, windows, porches, siding
- · Landscaping to improve drainage or safety

INTERIOR

- Installation of grab bars, handrails, reduced tripping hazards
- Improve lighting, reduce tripping hazards
- Minor kitchen and bath modifications

CRITICAL REPAIRS

- Roof replacement
- Major system repair

Who qualifies?

- Own and live in a home in Bucks County needing repairs
- Household gross income below 80% of the Bucks' median family income

How does it work?

- Homeowners complete an application which is evaluated by Habitat Bucks.
- Habitat does a site visit to describe the scope of work and estimate the cost.
- Professional construction staff and volunteers make repairs to the home.
 Homeowners participate in the project as they are able.

Affordable cost

- Homeowners pay only a part of the cost of materials and subcontractors, based on their income.
- Zero interest loans are available.
- Sponsor donations, grants and homeowners' payments cover the cost of the project.
